Family Resources

Parent Report

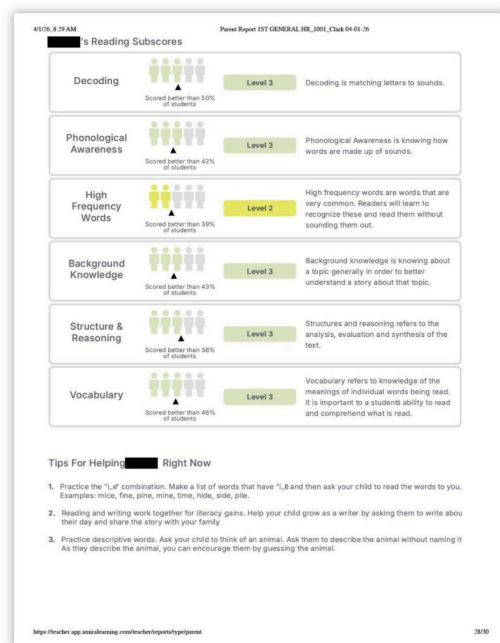
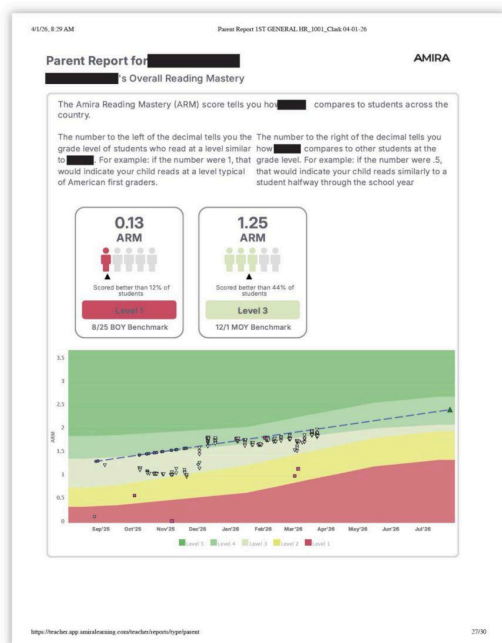
Amira’s Parent Report is a family-facing progress report generated by educators through the Teacher Dashboard. It communicates each student’s reading performance, growth data, and targeted skill-based recommendations that families can use to support literacy development at home. Recommendations are aligned to the student’s current instructional needs and may address areas such as phonological awareness, vocabulary, word study, and written response.

This resource is available in English and Spanish.

Sample at-home activities offered to families:

- Practice initial sounds by looking around your house for objects that start with the "B" sound."
- Practice descriptive words. Ask your child to think of an animal. Ask them to describe the animal without naming it. As they describe the animal, you can encourage them by guessing the animal.
- Practice words with double consonants. Make a list together and then read and sort them for practice. Examples: coffee, traffic, channel, battle, followed, funny, rabbit, matters, supper.
- After your child reads an article or story, ask them to write a few sentences about what they agree or disagree with.

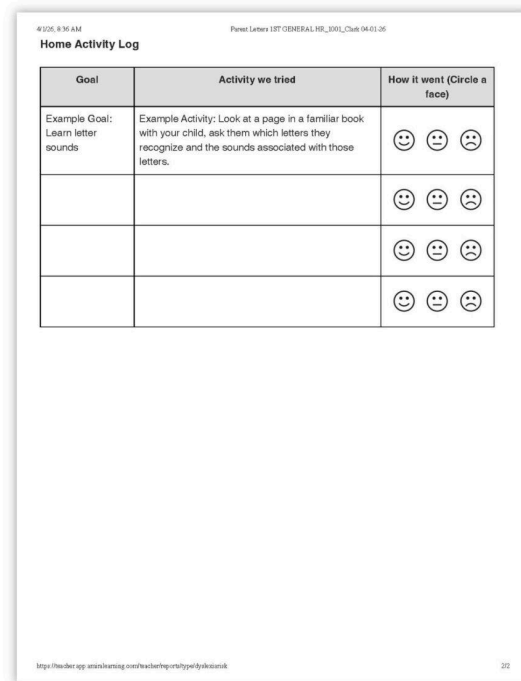
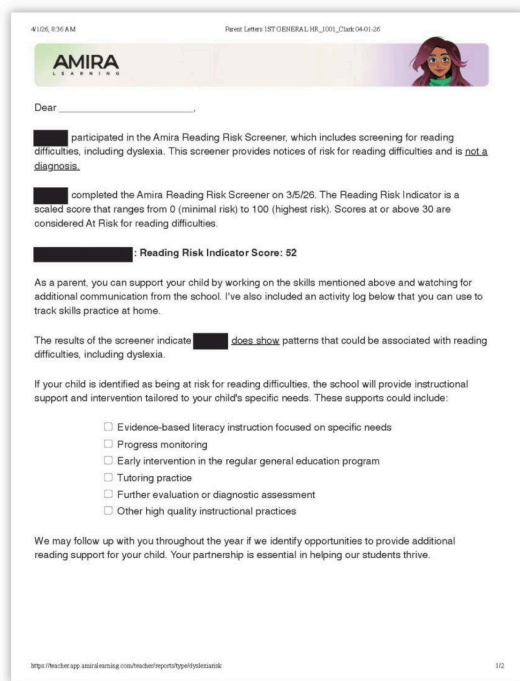

Reading Risk Letter

Amira’s Reading Risk Letter is a family-facing communication generated through the Reading Risk Report on the Teacher Dashboard. It helps schools share reading risk screening results in a clear and actionable way by including the student’s Reading Risk Indicator score, an explanation of screening results, potential school-based interventions and supports, and a home activity log for families.

Student Recordings

Educators can access recordings and scored transcripts from specific reading sessions to support progress monitoring, illustrate growth, and build family understanding of student strengths and needs.

Customizable Certificates

Customizable certificates are available on the Teacher Resource Hub and allow educators to recognize student goals, milestones, and achievements through school-based and family-facing celebration. Teachers can edit and print these certificates to acknowledge progress, reinforce motivation, and celebrate reading growth for individual students, groups, classes, or grade levels. Certificates may be sent home to families to strengthen school-home connections and highlight student success.

Badging Certificates

Amira Tutor provides printable certificates in the Teacher Dashboard through the Usage Report, tied to its student badging system. These certificates enable educators to formally recognize reading milestones and achievements as students earn new badges. Students may earn badges for a range of progress indicators, and teachers retain control over when badges are awarded and visible to students. Once awarded, certificates can be printed from the Usage Report and used to celebrate progress in class or sent home to families. Amira also supports custom badge-based awards, allowing educators to create additional certificates aligned to classroom goals and local recognition practices.
